

Monsignor Roger J. Landry

Monsignor Roger J. Landry, a priest of the Diocese of Fall River, Massachusetts, is National Director of The Pontifical Mission Societies USA. A Papal Missionary of Mercy, he served as a National Eucharistic Preacher for the USCCB's National Eucharistic Revival and helped lead the Seton Route of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage from New Haven, CT, to Indianapolis.

A graduate of Harvard College (1992) and the Pontifical North American College in Rome (1999), Monsignor Landry served as Attaché to the Holy See's Permanent Observer Mission to the United Nations in New York (2015-2022), Catholic Chaplain at Columbia University (2022-2024), Ecclesiastical Assistant to Aid to the Church in Need USA (2021-2024), and has been a pastor, newspaper editor, and high school chaplain in the Diocese of Fall River. He served as an on-site commentator for EWTN's coverage of the 2012 and 2025 conclaves as well as the funeral of Pope Benedict XVI.
